In a vision, John saw the downfall of empire. Empire claimed to dominate through virtue and good fortune; when in reality that dominance was gained by deception, coercion, and brutality. Empire's motivations and actions were all aimed at self-advancement and the pursuit of wealth. A byproduct was the corruption of others to its way of thinking.
